

Raymond J Hauck, Col. USAF, (Ret)

Colonel Hauck is a native of New Orleans, Louisiana and graduated from the University of Southwestern Louisiana, Lafayette, Louisiana in 1970 with a Bachelor's Degree in Subsurface Geology. He was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Air Force and attended the nine-month Aircraft Maintenance Officer's Course (AMOC) at Chanute AFB Rantoul, Illinois before starting a twenty-six year career in Air Force aircraft maintenance.

Colonel Hauck spent a large portion of his military career in the Strategic Air Command in Organizational Maintenance and Higher Headquarters positions located in bases from New York to California. While in California, Colonel Hauck took the opportunity to earn a Master's Degree in Education from Pepperdine University.

Colonel Hauck was promoted to Colonel in 1992 and became the first Tanker Division Chief at the newly formed Air Mobility Command where he was responsible for all KC-135, KC-10 and CLS aircraft serviceability, to include the presidential fleet. His final tour before retirement was at Tinker AFB, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma as the Aircraft Division Chief for the Oklahoma City Air Logistics Center (OC-ALC). He was responsible for the annual production of at least 60 Programmed Depot Maintenance (PDMs) on B-1 and B-52 Bombers, KC-135 Tankers and E-3 AWACS aircraft. He retired from active military service in June, 1996.

Colonel Hauck was offered a position by Precision Standard Inc. (PSI) a military contractor, where he became President of PEMCO Aeroplex, Birmingham, Alabama producing KC-135 and C-130 PDMS. He eventually grew into the President of PEMCO where he took responsibility for not only PEMCO Aeroplex but also PEMCO World Air Services (PWAS), Dothan, Alabama for the commercial sector of PSI. PWAS performed heavy checks for multiple tier one airlines and also developed, fabricated and installed an STC cargo conversion for B737s.

Colonel Hauck was tapped by the Governor of Alabama to be the Aerospace Commissioner for Alabama in 1998 and also help form and lead the Alabama Aerospace Association, as president, to help expand the Aviation Industry in the state.

Colonel Hauck left PEMCO in 2004 to help TIMCO Aviation develop a military product line where he became the Senior Vice President for Military Business Development. To date, his noteworthy efforts are highlighted by two significant contracts. The first spanned eight consecutive years for Progressive Structural Inspections on HC-130H for the US Coast Guard Maritime fleet. Additionally, his efforts were equally successful in winning the prestigious USAF KC-10 contractor logistics support (CLS) contract. The first nine-year contract was with Northrop Grumman (NGTS) with two contiguous lines of KC-10 "C" Checks followed by the recent 10 year award for 4 lines of "C" Checks with L-3 Communications.

Military awards include: Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal with 8 Oak Leaf Clusters, Commendation Medal, National Defense Service Metal with 2 Stars.

Colonel Hauck is married to Linda Hauck for 39 years and resides in Birmingham, Alabama. They have four children and six grandchildren.
