Question 1: *The public may participate in the rulemaking process by filing written comments.*

A: True. § [11.39\(a\)](#) instructs the public to file written comments on any rulemaking document that asks for comments.

B: False.

Question 3: *The public may only submit comments on the list of rulemaking actions in § [11.39\(a\)](#).*

A: True.

B: False. § [11.39\(a\)](#) applies to *any* rulemaking document, the list is inclusive but not exclusive of other potential rulemaking actions. In fact, www.federalregister.gov accepts comments on final rules, petitions, and other rulemakings.

Question 2: *The public may request a public meeting on any rulemaking.*

A: True. § [11.39\(b\)](#) explains that a request for (or participation in) a public meeting is an option for engaging the rulemaking process. (See § [11.51](#))

B: False.

Question 4: *The public may file petitions for rulemaking asking the FAA to adopt, amend or repeal a rule.*

A: True. See § [11.39\(b\)](#).

B: False.
