## § **11.47** May I ask for more time to file my comments?

Yes, if FAA grants your request for more time to file comments, we grant all persons the same amount of time. We will notify the public of the extension by a document in the Federal Register. If FAA denies your request, we will notify you of the denial. To ask for more time, you must file a written or electronic request for extension at least 10 days before the end of the comment period. Your letter or message must—

- (a) Show the docket number of the rule at the top of the first page;
- (b) State, at the beginning, that you are requesting an extension of the comment period;
- (c) Show that you have good cause for the extension and that an extension is in the public interest;
- (d) Be sent to the address specified for comments in the rulemaking document on which you are commenting.

## § [11.47](#) May I ask for more time to file my comments?

**A:** True. Section [11.47](#) sets no limitations on who may request more time to file comments, though individuals making requests must demonstrate good cause/public interest for the extension.

**A:** True.

**B:** False. Section [11.47](#) states the FAA will grant all persons the same amount of time to comment and notify the public of the extension by document in the FEDERAL REGISTER.

**Question 3:** *Comment extension requests must be filed at least 10 days before the end of the comment period.*

**A:** True. Section [11.47](#) requires persons ask for more time by filing a written or electronic request at least 10 days before the end of the comment period.

**B:** False.

**Question 4:** *After a comment period has been extended, no further requests for more time will be granted.*

**A:** True.

**B:** False. Section [11.47](#) does not prohibit multiple extension requests. Persons requesting additional time must follow the rule's criteria – particularly showing good cause/public interest – regardless of previous changes to the comment period.
