§ 21.2 Falsification of applications, reports, or records.

- (a) A person may not make or cause to be made—

B: False. § [21.2\(a\)\(4\)](#) states that a person may not make or cause to be made any alteration of any certificate or approval issued under “this part”, i.e., part [21](#).

Question 3: Section [21.2](#) prohibits intentionally false or misleading statements in any record used to show compliance with part [21](#).

A: True. See § [21.2\(a\)\(2\)](#).

B: False.

Question 4: The commission of an act prohibited by § [21.2\(a\)](#) is a basis for suspension or revocation of any certificate or approval held by that person.

A: True.

B: False. § [21.2\(b\)\(2\)](#) states that commission of a prohibited act is a basis for suspending or revoking any certificate or approval issued under “this part”, i.e., part [21](#), and held by that person.
